GEORGETOWN ORDINANCE NO. G-90-3

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS WITHIN THE TOWN LIMITS OF GEORGETOWN, INDIANA.

Section I: As used herein, Firearms shall be defined as any pistol, revolver, rifle, shotgun, machine gun, or other weapon which uses gunpowder, gas, or their equivalent to propel any type of a projectile.

Section II: It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge any firearm within the town limits of Georgetown, Indiana.

Section III: It is a defense to any violation of this ordinance that the person was engaged in the defense of property or the defense of a person at the time such firearm was discharged; was acting under legal authority to discharge the firearm; or the discharge of such firearm is justified as using reasonable force in affecting an arrest or preventing an escape.

Section IV: It is intended that any defense outlined in Section III hereof be those defenses established by state law and codified in I.C.35-41-3-1, et seq, as amended.

Section V: Any person who violates this ordinance shall be fined not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each offense.

Section VI: This ordinance shall become effective after its passage and publication in accordance with the Indiana

code.
