

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING SIDEWALKS IN THE TOWN OF GEORGETOWN


BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Georgetown, Indiana:

1. It is declared public policy of the Town of Georgetown, Indiana that sidewalks should be used primarily for pedestrian traffic. Bicycles shall be permitted on said sidewalks on the condition that their use does not inhibit regular pedestrian traffic. Discretion shall be used by the Town Marshall and/or his deputies/reserves as to whether the use of bicycles is inhibiting said pedestrian traffic.
2. No person shall ride, walk, or lead a horse or pony on any sidewalk.
3. Property owners who possess property adjacent to a sidewalk shall be responsible for any foliage that may inhibit the path of any person using a sidewalk.


Whoever violates any provision of this ordinance shall be fined a sum of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00 for each offense.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Georgetown Town Council and shall repeal Ordinance No. G83-01.




