

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SEWER USE ORDINANCE NO. G-92-04.

WHEREAS, The Town Council of the Town of Georgetown heretofore passed and ordained Ordinance No. G-92-04, an ordinance regulating the use of private and public sewers and drains, and providing for penalties for violation thereof, (hereinafter "Sewer Use Ordinance"), on or about June 15, 1992; and

WHEREAS, The Town Council of the Town of Georgetown believes it is in the best interests of its residents to amend a certain portion of the aforementioned G-92-04, namely to amend that portion of said ordinance relating to "penalties", set forth in Article VIII, Section 2;


NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Georgetown, Indiana as follows:

Article I. That Article VIII, Section 2, of the Sewer Use Ordinance, G-92-04, be and hereby is changed, altered and amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 2. Any person who shall continue any violation (other than a violation of Article V, Section 1), beyond the time limit provided for in Article VIII, Section 1 shall be fined in an amount not less than five (5) dollars and not exceeding five hundred (500) dollars, for each violation occurring prior to or on July 14, 1994. Any persons who continue such violation after July 14, 1994, shall be fined in an amount of not less than twenty-five (25) dollars and not exceeding five hundred (500) dollars for each violation. Each day in which any such violation shall continue shall be deemed a separate offense."

Article II. All other portions and provisions of the Sewer Use Ordinance, G-92-04, not in direct conflict with this Ordinance shall be deemed to be in full force and effect, unaltered by this Amendment.




