A RESOLUTION APPROVING HEARING FOR SALE OF NON-SURPLUS PROPERTY, BROADBAND EQUIPMENT

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Georgetown, Indiana (hereinafter this "Town Council") is the legislative body of the Town of Georgetown, County of Floyd, State of Indiana (the "Town"); and,

WHEREAS, the Indiana Code provides for the disposal of non-surplus utility property pursuant to IND. CODE 8-1.5-2-4 et. seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Georgetown has previously adopted its Resolution to Sell Non-Surplus Property, Broadband Equipment R-09-14; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has received on the 14th day of September, 2009 the written appraisal of the panel of appraisers, being signed by two or more of the appraisers from such panel, thus constituting a good and valid appraisal in the amount of \$92,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF GEORGETOWN, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: The Town Council resolves to sell non-surplus broadband equipment owned by the Town.

SECTION 2: The Town Council sets a public hearing on the sale of such non-s	urplus		
broadband equipment on the 26 day of Ottober 2009 at 650 AM/B	Mat		
, which hearing date is not more than forty-five (45) days from the n			
of the above mentioned written appraisal and which hearing date is at least thirty (30) days from the			
date notice will be provided as set forth below.			

SECTION 3: The purpose for the public hearing shall be (i) to review and explain the appraisal, (ii) receive public comment on the proposed sale of the non-surplus property and (iii) to consider the adoption of an ordinance providing for the sale of such property.

SECTION 4: Pursuant to IC 5-3-1-2(b), notice of such hearing must be published once, at least thirty (30) days prior to such hearing per IC 8-1.5-2-5(e), and the Town Clerk/Treasurer is directed to provide such notice to the publisher.
