**Regular Town Council Meeting**

**Pledge of Allegiance**

**Roll Call**

Council members present: Everett Pullen, Josh Williams, Kathy Haller, and Chris Loop. Also in attendance: Bob Woosley, Steve Broadus, Denny Kunkel, and Brenton Fender.

**Minutes**

Josh Williams made a motion to approve the minutes for the April 18, 2016 Regular Meeting. Seconded by Chris Loop and approved 3-0. Kathy Haller abstained.

Josh Williams made a motion to approve the minutes for the April 27, 2016 Special Meeting. Seconded by Kathy Haller and approved 4-0.

**Department Reports**

**Georgetown Police**

Chief Denny Kunkel informed the Council that through the end of May the Georgetown Police Department would be working extra as part of Operation Pullover. Extra officers will be out on the weekends to focus on seatbelt violations. Officers have been encountering an increasing amount of hypodermic needles. Chief Kunkel stated that he would like to see town ordinances cleaned up.

**Public Works**

Georgetown Public Works' employees have requested a utility broom attachment for the skid steer. The town received three quotes. Although Cat was the highest quote, it was specifically engineered to work with town's Cat skid steer and therefore preferred by the utility employees.

**Town Engineer**

Town Engineer Bob Woosley recommended that the Council award Fulkerson Contracting \$20,000 for extending the ditch in Brookstone to help alleviate flooding at the lift station. Chris Loop made a motion to approve this request. Seconded by Josh Williams and approved 4-0.

Chris Loop made a motion to approve E & B paving for the base and alternate bid, allowing work to commence once the state distribution has been received. Seconded by Josh Williams and approved 4-0.

Mr. Woosley informed the Council that he would get quotes for paving the lift station access road in Brookstone.

Mr. Woosley had recommended some changes to the West Oaks development before accepting their sewers.

Mr. Woosley reported that the Brine Agreement with Floyd County has been signed.

According to Mr. Woosley there is a drainage issue at 1005 Estate Circle that has been exasperated by recent utility clearing. The property borders with the Floyd County so Mr. Woosley will be working with them on the issue.

### **Building Commissioner**

Steve Broadus informed the council that he has not heard anything from Kristi Fox regarding Steve Kepley's property. Mr. Broadus also stated that certified mail was not being accepted at 8991 High St.

### **Old Business**

Chris Loop made a motion to have the Clerk-Treasurer's Office work with President Pullen and Jamie Schillmiller to post an ad in the paper for the hire of a utilities employee. Seconded by Josh Williams and approved 4-0.
